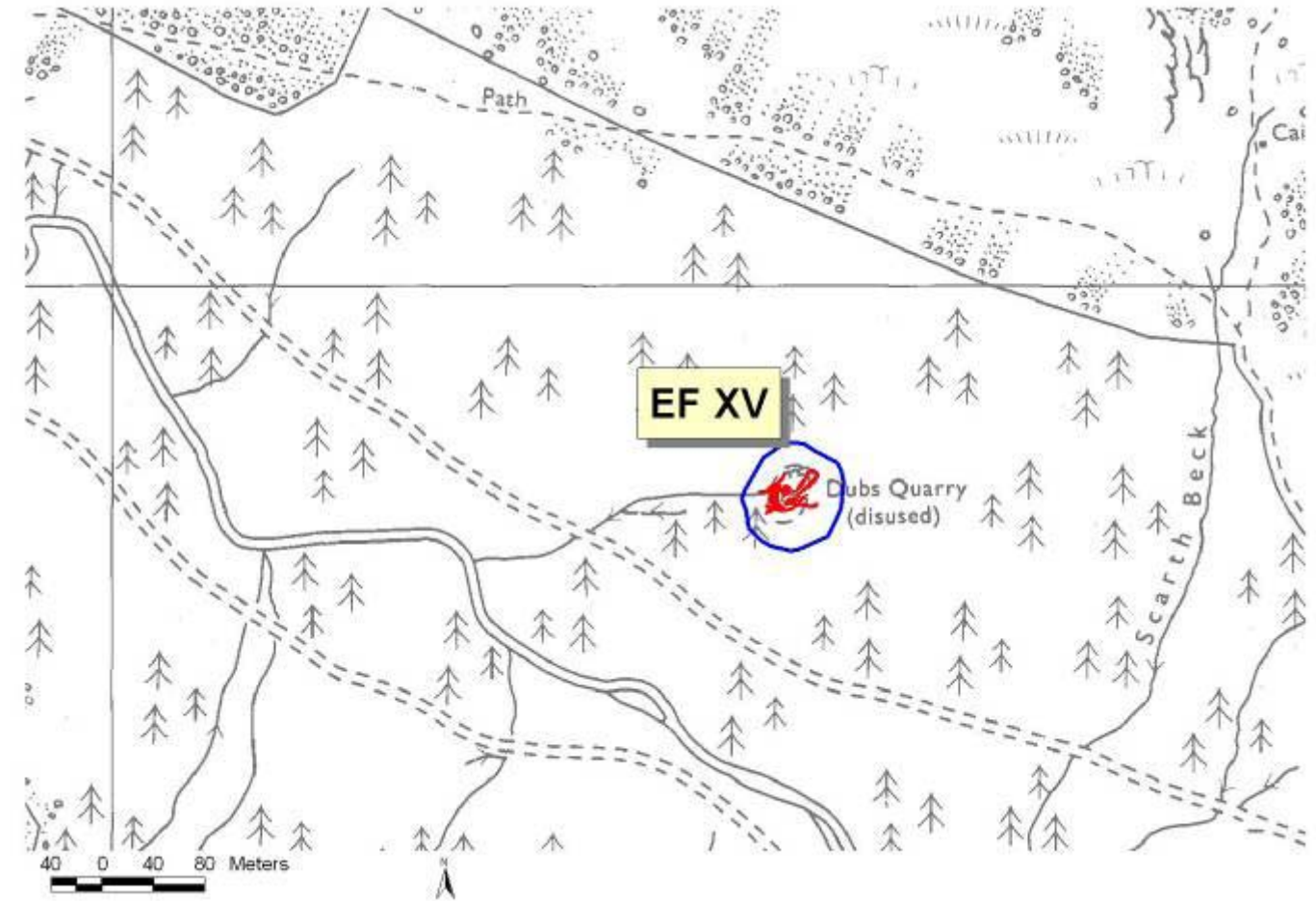


## Wild Ennerdale – Management of Principal Archaeological Sites

<b>Site Name:</b>	<b>EF XV Dubs Quarry</b>				
<b>Scheduled:</b>	No	<b>Importance</b>	2	<b>Local Significance:</b>	2
<b>Description:</b>	A small localised nineteenth century slate quarry at the head of the valley located on the south facing valley slope approximately 1km west of Blacksail				
<b>Past History:</b>	In open grassland pre aforestation in the 1930's. From 1930's until 2003 within Conifer Forest. Since clear felling of the forest in 2003 the site has been in the open again.				
<b>Current Habitat:</b>	Open developing vegetation following clear fell. Some planting of juniper and native woodland planned around the site but a buffer will be left unplanted.				
<b>Management prescription:</b>	Maintain a 20m buffer between the edge of the site and any planted groups. Cut and clear felling debris from rear of quarry and eastern edge during 2007-8
