Environmental Impact Assessment (Forestry) (England and Wales) Regulations 1999, as amended

We have now completed the EIA screening for your afforestation at Ennerdale, Head of Valley.

I can confirm that it is the Forestry Commission's opinion that this proposal will not require our consent under the EIA Regulations. This decision is valid for only five years from the date of this letter, and shall cease to have effect beyond 13/12/2023.

If you propose to carry out any of the work in your application after this date, you should inform us beforehand and we will do another check to see whether our consent is required or not.

If your proposal changes from the one we have just screened you may require a new EIA determination from us. Should you implement a different proposal without seeking our Assessment or Opinion we may consider enforcement action. This may require you to either assess or address any significant impacts the works have had or may have on the environment.
